In the event for the 2015/2016 nipper calendar at Ocean Grove Surf Life Saving Club presentations were held last weekend. Results were tallied from the club championship morning in February. MOUNTAIN to MOUTH.....M~M2016

This is an extreme Arts festival happening in the Geelong region on Fri 6- Sat 7th May.

What is M~M?

M~M is an arts walk, lead by a specially commissioned art CANOE which is carried for the duration. It begins at the You Yangs mountain range, crosses Geelong's industrial heartland at nightfall and arrives in the city centre to collide with Geelong After Dark, a night of extreme and unexpected arts. At dawn the next day, the trail follows Barwon River through rolling Bellarine farmland, along ocean beach to reach river mouth at sunset. The walk is punctuated with edgy artworks commissioned for M~M, bringing people together through shared experiences of extreme arts that celebrate our land. In the tradition of Wadawurrung, M~M creates a contemporary songline across the Geelong and Bellarine regions.

WHEN IS M~M2016?

M~M2016 starts on **Friday 6 May 2016** at 1pm, with the *Gathering of the Elders* ceremony at You Yangs Big Rock. After this, the walk begins! Walk stages vary in distance from 3-14 kilometres each. Participants can choose to walk any one or more of the stages, or the whole distance. The walk will conclude on **Saturday 7 May 2016** at Barwon Heads Foreshore, with walkers arriving at approx. 6pm for the final ceremony, *Gathering of the Elements*. A feature of the walk are 12 Songline Stations that come alive with 'walking circles'. Artworks are commissioned from leading artists-responding to the environment and uniqueness of the Geelong region. Don't miss them. These artworks will only exist for a few hours and will be gone the next day. Our local Songline Stations will be on Ocean Grove Main Beach at 4-6pm (artwork by BHPS mum and local artist, Suyin Honeywell) and Barwon Heads next to the rotunda 5pm.

A main feature for Barwon Heads is that it's the site of the amazing CLOSING CEREMONY at 6-7pm on Sat 7th May..... at the jetty next to At The Heads restaurant.

It will be a really special performance using the beach on both sides of the river, the jetty and the ocean as the stage. BHPS Grade 6 students will be participating as Fish Puppeteers and the ceremony culminates with the BURNING of the CANOE!

There will be fire and it will be awesome!
